<p>超高齢社会である日本が直面する法的課題は、既に高齢社会化し、あるいは、将来、高齢社会へと向かうアジア太平洋地域の諸国にとって現に、または将来的に共通の課題です。障害者権利条約が求める意思決定支援の要請への各国の対応、取引の安全や本人保護との調整、高齢者による交通事故等による損害の負担の分配等、高齢社会が抱える法的課題と対応のあり方についての経験を共有し、議論を深めます。</p>		<p>Japan is now facing various legal issues arising from being aged society. These issues are the current or future common challenges to other countries in the Asian-Pacific region. The session will share the experiences in response to the need of supporting decision-making of the elderly persons under the Convention on the Rights of the Persons with Disabilities, balance between the legal protection of the elderly persons and the safety of transactions, and allocation of the damages arising from the traffic accidents and other incidents involving the elderly person as discussed in a recent case of the Supreme Court of Japan.</p>
